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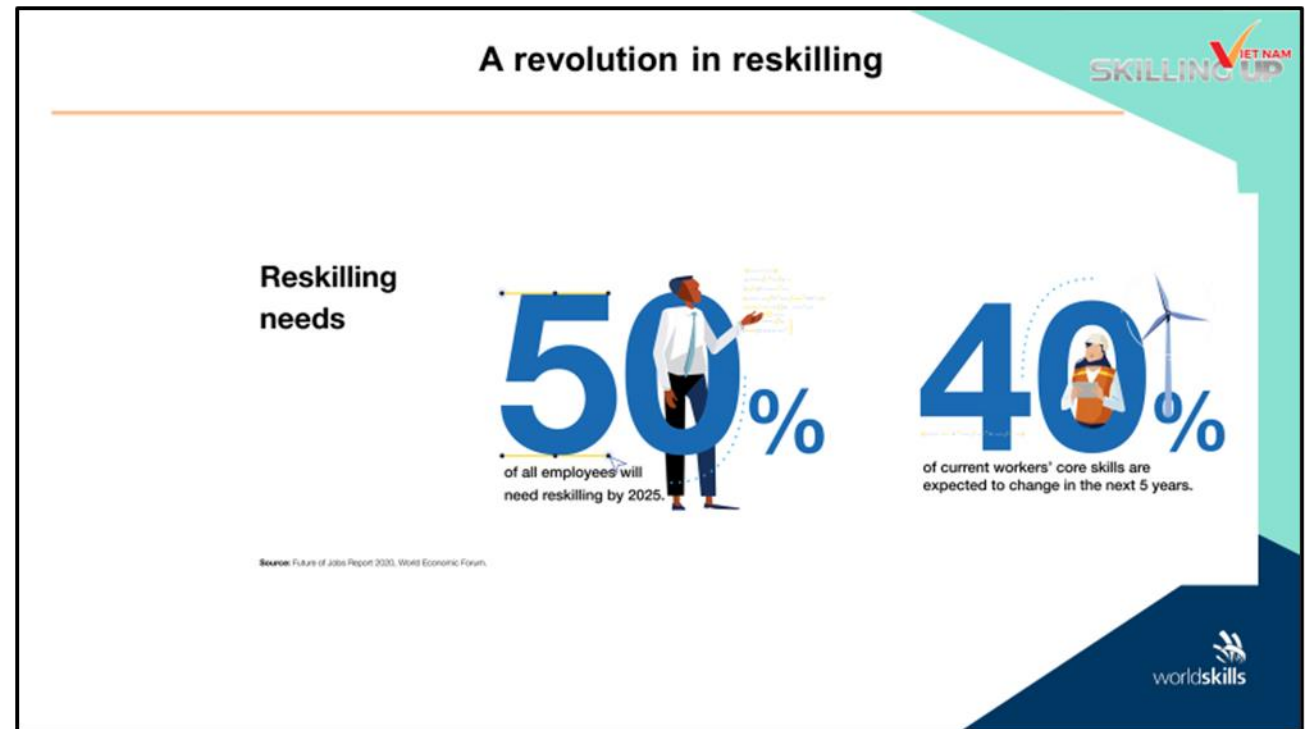

Key messages from the REGIONAL POLICY DIALOGUE of ASEAN TVET COUNCIL – Hanoi, 29.06 - 30.06.22

- SSCs are meant to be facilitators to produce the skills that the economy needs
- SSCs are multi stakeholder organizations. Effective employer engagement is the single most important factor for successful SSCs
- SSCs have a clear role and mandate of the SSCs



Mandates of the Sector Skills Council

- ☐ Providing Labour Market Information
- ☐ Providing policy advice on employment
- ☐ Providing policy advice on skills development
- ☐ Endorsing norms (VQF) and standards (NOSS)
- ☐ Accrediting (if mandated) the skills certification centers
- ☐ Facilitating the matching of skills supply and demand

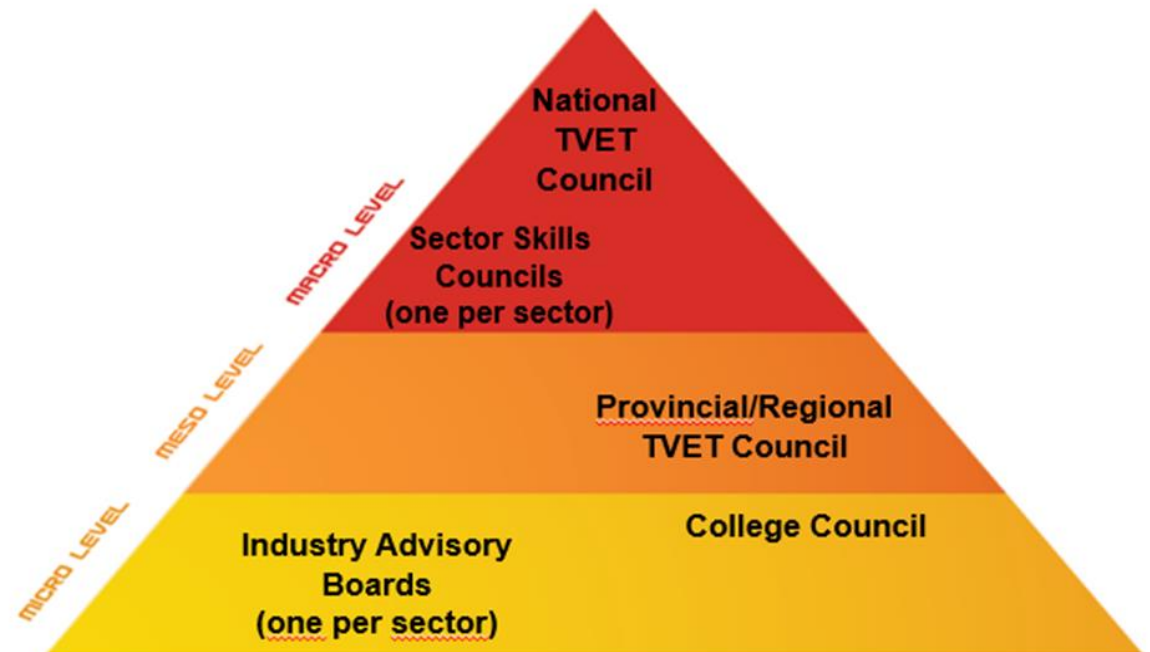
The implications

According to the level of the SSC mandate we can expect different complexity of the:

1. Governance Structure & Accountability
2. Stakeholder Engagement
3. Mobilizing Resource and Funding

While at national level we are dealing with separate sectors, at the microlevel of school or institute or college we should establish partnerships with the business sector
